4.1 Description of first aid measures

- General information: If medical advice is needed, have product container or label at hand.
Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse.
- In case of inhalation: If breathing is difficult, remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Seek medical attention if problems persist.
- Following skin contact: After contact with skin, first remove product with a dry cloth and then wash the skin with plenty of water. In case of skin reactions, consult a physician.
- After eye contact: Immediately flush eyes with plenty of flowing water for 10 to 15 minutes holding eyelids apart. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Subsequently consult an ophthalmologist.
- After swallowing: Rinse mouth immediately and drink plenty of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Do not induce vomiting. Seek medical attention.

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

5.1 Extinguishing media

5.3 Advice for firefighters

Fire residuals and contaminated extinguishing water must be disposed of in accordance with the regulations of the local authorities.

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

6.3 Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Absorb with liquid-binding material (e.g. sand, diatomaceous earth, acid- or universal binding agents) and place in closed containers for disposal.
In case of greater quantities: Collect mechanically (use only explosion-proof equipment when pumping out).
Never return spills in original containers for re-use.
